Tear Drainage Blockers

Patients with dry eyes or dry spots on their corneas (keratitis) may benefit from punctal plugs. The tears on your eyes are drained away into two tiny drainage holes in the inside corners of your eyelids. Placing a blocker or plug in an eyelid drainage area acts as a dam which may help relieve dry eye symptoms or heal an eye with corneal irritation. Some of the plugs are permanent and some dissolve in a few months. The blockers are often to be used with artificial tear drops and ointment for maximal healing and comfort. Patients who benefit from punctal plugs include laser vision correction patients, contact lens patients and non-surgical dry eye patients.

Most insurance companies will cover the cost of the insertion and placement of punctal plugs. If your insurance company requires a co-payment or deductible, you will be responsible for this cost.
